Klaas Van 't Veld, Associate Professor, Department of Economics, University of Wyoming
You would not know this from reading the newspaper or listening to politicians, but the vast majority of
economists (both liberal and conservative) agree that (1) a large federal budget deficit is bad for the
economy, but (2) the deficit should not be cut during a recession - if anything, it should be expanded,
through tax cuts and/or increases in government spending. This talk will introduce just enough basic
macroeconomics to explain why, using nothing more technical than a few simple diagrams and a story.
